Celebrant Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins; **People His mercy endures forever.**

In this Season of Lent, this season of almsgiving, fasting, and charity, may the peace of the Lord be always with you.

Jesus said, "The first commandment is this: Hear, O Israel: The Lord your God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these." *Mark* 12:29-31

THIS WEEK'S LESSONS:

Genesis 9:8-17

God said to Noah and to his sons with him, ⁹'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, ¹⁰ and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. ¹¹I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' ¹²God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: ¹³I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and

the earth. ¹⁴When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' ¹⁷God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.'

1 Peter 3:18-22

Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

Mark 1:9-15

Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' ¹² And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. ¹³He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. ¹⁴ Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, ¹⁵and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

IT'S STILL NOT TOO LATE TO JOIN: RECTOR'S LENTEN BIBLE STUDY - THE

Gospel of Mark: Mark's Gospel is the shortest of the four Gospels and known for its quick pace. Most scholars consider it to be the earliest written. In this liturgical year we have just entered, most of our Sunday Gospel readings will be drawn from Mark. Join the Rector as we take an in-depth look at this perspective on Jesus' life, teaching, healing, suffering, death, and resurrection.

Many people find that engaging in Bible study provides a good Lenten discipline and prepares them to receive the joy of Easter more fully. The six-week course will meet on six consecutive Wednesday evenings via ZOOM, from 7:00-8:30. (Dates: Feb 24th, March 3rd, 10th, 17th, 24th, 31st.) Our textbook will be the Gospel of Mark; a copy will be provided to ensure that we are all reading the same translation, so no cost is involved. Each week, prior to our meeting, you will receive a short series of reflection questions, along with your ZOOM invitation.

St. George's College, Jerusalem, Lenten Study – Following Jesus From Galilee to Golgotha: Begins Wednesday, Feb 17th; ends Saturday, April 3rd – Daily 9:00am-5:30pm – Self-paced, free course in six sessions. Individuals need to register by email: resources@sgcjerusalem.org – Explore the geography of the Holy Land, following Jesus from Galilee to Golgotha. Each session will reflect on the theme with questions for exploration. There are links to short films from the Holy Land. Each week's session includes:

- A five-minute on-site film expanding the theme
- Thought-provoking material on the theme; Questions for reflection
- Two on-line discussions with the Dean, live from Jerusalem

WORK HAS BEGUN! The work to replace the roof on the Parish Hall with a standing seam metal roof has begun and the building is looking quite handsome! Cost for the project totals \$125,000.00. Following advice from the investment committee, the vestry has unanimously endorsed a financial plan consisting of:

- withdrawing \$40,000.00 from the endowment;
- a \$50,000.00 loan from the diocese at only 2% interest for 5 years;
- and an appeal to fund the remaining \$35,00.00 from members of the congregation. Presently, we have raised \$63,765.20 toward this goal! THANK YOU!! Funds raised above the stated \$35K goal will ease the needs imposed by the endowment withdrawal and diocesan loan.
